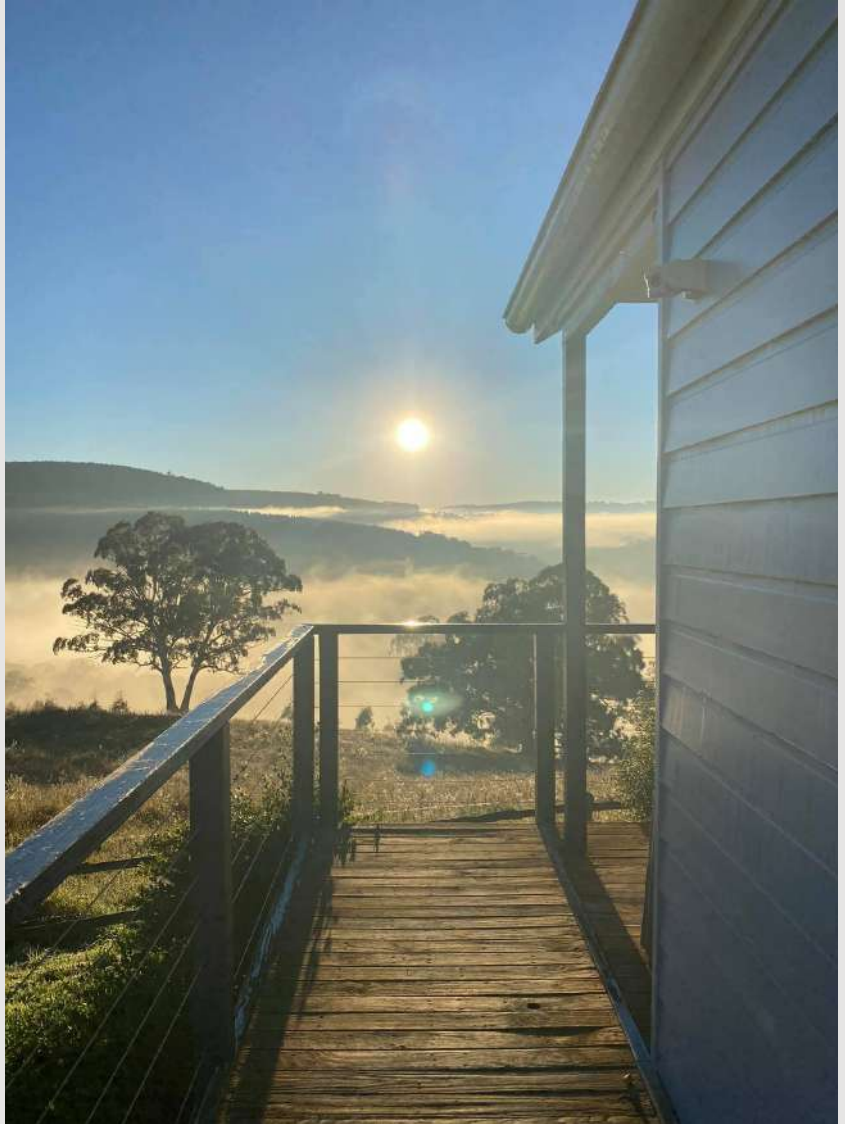

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Our STORY



Peter & Heather Gracey purchased the property in 2010, the third owners of Bindo Creek Cabins & Watersedge.

Since taking over, the pair have made significant improvements to the property including the function area and cattle yards.



The Cabins were originally part of the 2000 Sydney Olympic village, used to house athletes and media personnel.

Bindo is also a working farm, running 25 Angus breeders plus their calves. You will see the cattle on the property.

The Cabins

WOLLEMI, CYPRESS, SNOWGUM & RADIATA

The Bindo Cabins

Snowgum is the larger of the four cabins. The first bedroom has a queen bed fitted with an electric blanket, the second bedroom holds a single bed and single bunk bed with a pull out trundle bed.

There are two bathrooms; One with a shower & toilet, the other with a bath & toilet.

We have also catered for the whole group with enough cutlery, plates, mugs & glasses to feed your mates in the smaller cabins so there is no need to BYO!

Cypress, Radiata & Wollemi have two bedrooms. One bedroom containing a queen bed fitted with and electric blanket, the second bedroom has a single bunk bed with pull out trundle bed. Each has their own bathroom including a toilet, vanity and spa bath/shower.

We really have thought of everything you need to enjoy a relaxed weekend away, all you need to bring is food and wine!



Your arrival

Your cabin will be available from the agreed check in time. We ask that all guests also vacate by the agreed check-out time.

Upon your arrival the main entry key will be located on a hook on the back of the post identifying your car parking space, next to your cabin. If you arrive after dark, the lights will be on. They are on a timer and will turn off around midnight.

Comprehensive, easy to follow directions will be sent to you upon full payment of the accommodation fee. Driving time from Sydney is 2.5 hours.

Oberon has a true mountain climate- variable and unpredictable. Make sure to pack warm clothes, including a jacket and wet weather footwear. The small township of Oberon is only a 10 minute drive from the cabins where you are able to do a grocery shop from the local IGA or foodworks. Liquor can also be purchased from both supermarkets. All cabins have a wood fueled combustion heater; all wood is provided. Panel heaters are also located in the bedrooms.

BBQ/Pizza oven

A gas BBQ & gas pizza oven are located between the Cypress and Snowgum cabins. Operating instructions are posted beside it. If the connected bottle becomes empty, there is a spare bottle available. A wood BBQ is provided down at the creek.

Breakages

Your accommodation tariff is not intended to cover damage to furniture, games equipment, windows etc. A breakage deposit was requested and may be applied towards the cost of any repairs or replacements arising from carelessness. We want to ensure that all our guests have access to well-maintained facilities.

Coffee Machine

A Nespresso Pod coffee machine are available for use in all four cabins along with coffee and hot chocolate pods.

Cots

Cots and high chairs are available on request.

Games

Cards and other games are located in the cupboard in the entrance way in Snowgum or above the microwave in the smaller cabins. Please pack away when not in use.

Garbage

A rubbish bin is located in the kitchen. Extra bin liners are stored near the bin. There is a large wheelie bin for each cabin for general rubbish, these are located in the screened area near the Radiata cabin.

Keys

Upon your arrival, the main entry key was located on a hook on the back of the post identifying your car parking space. Please return it to this position when you leave.

Kitchen

The Snowgum cabin has a full kitchen complete with a fan forced oven and hot plates, microwave, fridge, kettle, toaster, slow cooker, crockery, cutlery, cake mixer, baking dishes, saucepans, serving boards and drinking glasses. It is also equipped with a large table that seats up to 21 people, the perfect place for shared meals.

Wollemi Cabin has a kitchenette including a fan forced oven and hot plates, microwave, fridge, kettle, toaster, slow cooker, crockery, cutlery and drinking glasses.

Radiate & Cypress Cabins have a kitchenette with microwave, fridge, kettle, toaster, slow cooker, crockery, cutlery and drinking glasses.



Linen

All beds are made up ready for your arrival. Bath towels are provided for each guest, please remember they are bath towels and should not be used outside. Extra blankets are located in the wardrobes.

TV/DVD

Television reception is excellent and all channels are available.

The Cabins are equipped with DVD players. Please note that children should not play with the TV and controls.

Smoking

Smoking inside the cabins is prohibited. If you choose to smoke outside, please dispose of litter in the garbage bins provided.

Smoke detectors

Located in the kitchen, bedrooms and hallway. They are battery operated with main power back-up. If excess smoke escapes from the wood heater it will set off the smoke detectors. If this does happen, open the windows and doors, locate and solve the problem. When the smoke clears the detectors will stop automatically. For your safety, they cannot be disabled.

The Property



Boundaries

Bindo Creek Cabins are set on 100 acres. A fence incorporating the entry gate marks the top boundary (south) approximately 100 metres behind this building. The bottom boundary (north) is the Bindo Creek. The side boundaries are approximately 300 metres to the east and west and can be seen, in part, from the cabins.

"Trespassing Prohibited" signs are erected on the boundary fences. Please do not cross these fences.

Cattle/Livestock

Cattle graze the paddocks within Bindo Creek Cabins land, and neighbouring properties run livestock. Cattle are very timid and spook easily. They will move away if you approach. Please do not chase them. It may cause them to panic and break through fences and injure themselves. Please shut all gates.

Driving on the property

Please keep all vehicles (even if they are 4WD) on the gravel roads. Much of the property is steep, there are hidden rocks, wombat holes, logs and boggy patches. Take care driving on the entry road, there are some tight corners and you may encounter other users.

Fires

The lighting of any outdoor fires (including campfires & bonfires) is absolutely prohibited. The BBQ at the cabins and the creek is for cooking purposes only. The outside fire pit cannot be used if there is a total fire ban or if there is excessive wind.

Firearms

Absolutely no firearms to be brought to or discharged at Bindo Creek Cabins (guns frighten livestock and the bullets can travel a long way).

Flora/Fauna

Kangaroos, echidna, numerous parrots, wombats etc. inhabit the property. Please admire them, but do not harm them. Please do not damage the local flora or cut down any trees.

The Property



Fishing

Trout can be taken from inland rivers in NSW (including Bindo Creek) between the October long weekend and the end of May, provided they are 250mm (10 inches) or greater in length. At other times fishing is not permitted in the rivers. This is to give the fish an opportunity to breed undisturbed.

Gates

Please leave all gates as you find them and, if in doubt, closed. There are cattle in the surrounding paddocks. They will destroy the gardens if they get in. Please check the gates if children play in the paddocks.

Motorbikes

The conditions of our consent to operate a tourist facility prohibit the use of motor bikes within the boundaries of Bindo Creek Cabins. This is because there is steep terrain and a risk that neighbouring livestock will be frightened and may break through fences.

Pets

Unfortunately no pets are allowed at Bindo Creek Cabins. This is a condition of our consent. The reason for this is that they may chase and frighten livestock or kill native fauna.

Swimming

Swimming at Bindo Creek is prohibited as the water is not always clear and there are hidden rocks. Alternatively, there is a modern heated outdoor pool in the township of Oberon, open in the summer months.

Septic system

Waste water goes into an in-ground septic tank and trench. Please do not flush foreign objects down the toilet. Used oils, etc. should be placed in a container in the bin.

Walking Trails

You are free to explore on foot within the boundaries of Bindo Creek Cabins. Boundary fences are signposted. Please do not trespass into neighbouring properties. Enjoy a pleasant walk down to the Creek via the gravel roadway which leads downhill from the gate past the Radiata Cabin.

In the warmer months be careful as in all country areas snakes are around.

Water

We must rely entirely upon rainwater and springwater, There is no mains supply. Please use only what you need. The water from the taps is quite safe to drink.

Wildlife

Bindo Creek Cabins are set on 100 acres and there is a variety of wildlife to be observed on occasions. Kangaroos, wallabies, wombats, the occasional echidna and rabbits are particularly active in the early morning and at dusk. They inhabit both the timbered areas and the open paddocks and hillsides.

There are lots of brightly coloured parrots that frequent the trees around the creek. These include yellow-tailed and white-tailed black cockatoos, gang-gang cockatoos (grey with red heads), galahs and sulphur-crested cockatoos. Wedge-tailed eagles and smaller hawks can occasionally be seen riding the air currents high above the cabins.



Things To Do

Oberon is a small rural community situated on a plateau at a height of 1130m above sea level. This area is well known for its Winter's, with several snow falls annually.

With a population of 3700, Oberon is a friendly, welcoming town with plenty to see and do.

- Putting all garbage from the kitchen, bedrooms, etc. in the wheelie bin and plastic bins located beside the 'Radiata' Cabin
- Removing all food from the fridge and cupboards
- Returning your glassware, crockery, cutlery etc. to your cabin
- Closing all windows
- Packing away any games
- Doing all washing up
- Turning off all lights, electric blanket and heaters
- Locking the external doors from the deck and laundry
- Placing the entry key back on the hook behind the post identifying your car space

In the event of a power outage you can call Endeavour Energy on 131 003 for an update as to when the power will be reconnected.

The cabins postcode is 2790 (It will be listed as Jenolan Caves area).

There will be no water to the cabins if there is a power outage as they run off a pump.

Water can be obtained from either tanks next to cabin number 1 & 4. Buckets are located in the laundry.
